Background:

The General Pharmaceutical Council is a new shadow organisation that became an independent legal entity on 12 March 2010.

The intention is for the General Pharmaceutical Council to become the regulatory body for Pharmacists, pharmacy technicians and pharmacy premises in England, Scotland and Wales, at which point responsibility for regulation will transfer over from the current regulator, the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain.

Until the date of transfer, which is yet to be determined, the General Pharmaceutical Council will be a shadow body and the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain will retain full regulatory responsibility in the interim.

This Data Dictionary Change Notice updates the NHS Data Model and Dictionary to:

- add a new NHS Business Definition for the General Pharmaceutical Council and
- update the existing NHS Business Definition for the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain to advise of the change.

Both NHS Business Definitions have been agreed by the appropriate organisation and will be updated once further details and dates are agreed.
