An offer is reasonable where:

• the offer of an Out-Patient Appointment is for a time and date three or more weeks from the time that the

or

• The PATIENT accepts the offer

or

• the offer of an <u>Out-Patient Appointment</u> or an <u>OFFER OF ADMISSION</u> is for a time and date three or more weeks from the time that the offer was made

or

• the PATIENT accepts the offer

or

• the offer is for the first Genitourinary Consultant Clinic Attendance in a Sexual Health And HIV Episode

or

• the offer is for any <u>APPOINTMENT</u> for treatment in a <u>Cancer Treatment Period</u>

or

the offer of an <u>APPOINTMENT</u> for a non-outpatient <u>CARE CONTACT</u> provided by a <u>Community Health Service</u> complies with local, publicly available/published policies for access to that <u>SERVICE</u>. These local policies should be clearly defined and specifically protect the clinical interests of vulnerable <u>PATIENTS</u> (e.g. children) and must have been agreed with clinicians, commissioners, <u>PATIENTS</u> and other stakeholders.
