- Helping health and care <u>ORGANISATIONS</u> improve the quality of the data they collect and send to the <u>Health and Social Care Information Centre</u> by setting standards and guidelines to help them assess how well they are doing
- Creating a register of all the information that the <u>Health and Social Care Information Centre</u> collect and produce, and publishing that information in a range of different formats so that it will be useful to as many people as possible while safeguarding the personal confidential data of individuals.

The <u>Health and Social Care Information Centre</u> collects, analyses and presents information for health and social care communities in England. ### Notes:

This requires the code of the <u>PERSON</u> making the referral. This will normally be a <u>CARE PROFESSIONAL</u> - a <u>GENERAL MEDICAL PRACTITIONER</u> or a <u>CONSULTANT</u>.

The intention is for this item to reflect the actual (true) referrer. For example, following a <u>GENERAL MEDICAL PRACTITIONER</u> referral, a <u>CONSULTANT</u> may subsequently refer the <u>PATIENT</u> to another <u>CONSULTANT</u> within the <u>Hospital Provider Spell</u>. The code of the <u>CONSULTANT</u> making the referral and the <u>CONSULTANTS ORGANISATION</u> should be recorded in the Commissioning Data Set (CDS) rather than the code of the <u>GENERAL MEDICAL PRACTITIONER</u> referrer. This also applies where a <u>CONSULTANT</u> refers an NHS <u>PATIENT</u> to another doctor for NHS-commissioned treatment at another <u>NHS Trust</u>, a non-NHS provider, or an overseas provider. Where the <u>CONSULTANT CODE</u> is not known, the <u>Organisation Data Service Default Code</u> C9999998 should be used.

In all other cases, the code of the referring <u>GENERAL MEDICAL PRACTITIONER</u> should be recorded, if applicable. When a locum refers, use the <u>GENERAL MEDICAL PRACTITIONER PPD CODE</u> of the <u>GENERAL PRACTITIONER</u> for whom the locum is acting.

See <u>CONSULTANT CODE</u> and <u>GENERAL MEDICAL PRACTITIONER (SPECIFIED)</u> for the codes available for <u>CONSULTANTS</u> and <u>GENERAL MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS</u> and <u>GENERAL DENTAL PRACTITIONERS</u>.

If the <u>REFERRER CODE</u> is not known or not applicable e.g., the <u>PATIENT</u> has self-presented, the <u>Organisation</u> <u>Data Service Default Code</u> (X9999998) should be used.
