Background:

It has been identified that the Data Elements Lower Layer Super Output Area (Residence) and ONS Local Government Geography Code (Local Authority District) are out of date in the NHS Data Model and Dictionary.

These Data Elements are currently only used in the following Data Sets:

- Genitourinary Medicine Clinic Activity Data Set
- HIV and AIDS Reporting Data Set
- NHS Health Checks Data Set
- Sexual and Reproductive Health Activity Data Set

The current NHS Data Model and Dictionary content is:

- Lower Layer Super Output Area (Residence):
 - The NHS Data Model and Dictionary default codes are currently:
 - Z99999999 - Scotland, Northern Ireland, Channel Islands, Isle of Man
 - X99999998 - Not Applicable (outside the United Kingdom) and
 - X99999999 - Not Known
 - Default Code Z99999999 is no longer required as the NHS Postcode Directory now contains the codes for:
 - S01006506 - S01013481 = Scotland
 - 95AA01S1 - 95ZZ16S2 = Northern Ireland
 - L99999999 = Channel Islands
 - M99999999 = Isle of Man
 - The Format/Length of the item in the NHS Data Model and Dictionary is currently "annnnnnn" but should be "max an9" as the Northern Ireland codes are eight characters.
- ONS Local Government Geography Code (Local Authority District):
 - The NHS Data Model and Dictionary default codes are currently:
 - L99999999 - Channel Island
 - M99999999 - Isle of Man
 - X99999998 - Not Applicable (outside the United Kingdom) and
 - X99999999 - Not Known
 - Default Codes L99999999 and M99999999 are no longer required as the NHS Postcode Directory now contains the codes for:
 - L99999999 = Channel Islands
 - M99999999 = Isle of Man
 - The Format/Length of the item in the NHS Data Model and Dictionary is currently min an3 max an9. This is because the Local Authority District equivalent codes in Northern Ireland were only three characters but have changed since they were included in the NHS Data Model and Dictionary. The Format/Length should be "max an9" to reflect this change.

This Data Dictionary Change Notice (DDCN) introduces new Data Elements:

- LOWER LAYER SUPER OUTPUT AREA (PERSON RESIDENCE)
- ONS LOCAL GOVERNMENT GEOGRAPHIC AREA CODE (LOCAL AUTHORITY DISTRICT)

These new Data Elements:

- Have been agreed with the Data Set Developers affected by this change and the Organisation Data Service (ODS)
- Will link to the NHS Postcode Directory, where the codes are held
- Will replace the existing Data Elements in the next versions of the Data Sets as they are taken through the Standardisation Committee for Care Information (SCCI) process.

Please note that the Organisation Data Service is planning to take a standard through the Standardisation Committee for Care Information (SCCI) process to cover the issuing of the default codes.

This Data Dictionary Change Notice (DDCN) also updates the NHS Postcode Directory (NHSPD) page in the NHS Data Model and Dictionary to remove out of date information and provide links to the "NHSPD User Guide" and "NHSPD Version Notes".

Background

- The [NHS Postcode Directory](#) is maintained, on behalf of the [Organisation Data Service](#), by the [Office for National Statistics](#).
- The [NHS Postcode Directory](#):
 - contains a record for every [POSTCODE](#) in the UK, Channel Islands and the Isle of Man

- associates each [POSTCODE](#) with a variety of geographical information, such as grid references and census area codes, and codes for National Health Care Groupings, Higher Level Health Geographies and health commissioning [ORGANISATIONS](#)
- file also includes pseudo [POSTCODES](#) covering default codes and overseas countries.
- Two versions are issued every quarter by the [Organisation Data Service](#):
 - The full [NHS Postcode Directory](#) is restricted to NHS users and users working in direct support of the NHS
 - The less comprehensive [Organisation Data Service](#) reduced [POSTCODE](#) data files are made available to all.
- Users are able to download files through the:
 - [Technology Reference Data Update Distribution Service \(TRUD\)](#) and
 - [Organisation Data Service pages](#) on the [Health and Social Care Information Centre](#) website.
- Full descriptions of the:
 - [NHS Postcode Directory](#) can be found at [Data Supplied by the Office of National Statistics](#)
 - Reduced [POSTCODE](#) data files can be found at [ODS Postcode Files](#).
- The [NHS Postcode Directory](#) (NHSPD) relates both current and terminated [POSTCODES](#) in the United Kingdom to a range of current statutory administrative, electoral, health and other area geographies. It also links [POSTCODES](#) to pre-2002 health areas, 1991 Census enumeration districts (for England and Wales) and both 2001 Census and 2011 Census output areas and super output areas. It helps support the production of area based statistics from postcoded data.
- The [NHS Postcode Directory](#) is produced by ONS Geography, who provide geographic support to the [Office for National Statistics](#) (ONS) and geographic services used by other organisations.
- The [NHS Postcode Directory](#) is issued quarterly.
- The [NHS Postcode Directory](#) User Guide contains information about the [NHS Postcode Directory](#) including:

 - data currency
 - the methodology for assigning areas to [POSTCODES](#)

- A set of Version Notes accompanies each quarterly release of the [NHS Postcode Directory](#). These contain a range of summary statistics and highlight important issues that may affect customers. The Version Notes provide information about postcode reorganisations, administrative and electoral area changes, the introduction of new methodologies and/or geographies and limitations that are specific to a particular release of the [NHS Postcode Directory](#).

Postcodes

- All [POSTCODES](#) made available via the [Organisation Data Service](#) postcode files have been standardised to the eight character postcode format as used by the Royal Mail's Postal Address File (PAF). All NHS [ORGANISATIONS](#) should ensure that they conform to the [POSTCODE](#) format.

[POSTCODES](#) are of the general format:

- The coding frame allows the use of digits 0 (zero) to 9 and the use of upper case alpha characters; no special characters are allowed.
- The fifth character of all standard format [POSTCODES](#) is always a space, and separates the outward and inward parts of the [POSTCODE](#). The outward part of the [POSTCODE](#) is left justified and can contain 2, 3 or 4 characters, and is space filled in character positions 3 and 4 where required. The inward part of the [POSTCODE](#) is always 3 characters.
